Dream Seed ideas related to the programme, planning, logistics, facilities or International Service Teams will improve the event and help realise the Jamboree dreams of young people.

Submitted Dream Seed ideas will be reviewed by the Youth Planning Team called "Team Cloud" to figure out how they can be implemented at Saemangeum by sharing the best ideas with the appropriate divisions of Jamboree Planning Team.

The deadline to submit Dream Seed ideas is 1 August 2022, one year before the 25th World Scout Jamboree, in order to allow the ideas to be applied and realised.



▲ How to build a Jamboree Contingent

• Agree as a National Scout Organization to send a Jamboree Contingent

The first vital step in preparing for the World Scout Jamboree is to decide as a National Scout Organization (NSO) to send a contingent. The World Scout Jamboree will require considerable commitment at the national level in areas such as recruiting participants, fundraising, and logistics planning.

• Appoint a Head of Contingent and send back the enclosed form

The Head of Contingent is an important position, since this person will be responsible for ensuring a safe, worthwhile and enjoyable Jamboree experience for your Contingent. Different NSOs have different ways of selecting their Head of Contingent, but we encourage all NSOs to appoint someone who is a proven leader, has Scouting experience in an international context, and has dedicated time to perform their role. Once you have appointed a Head of Contingent, please inform the Organizing Committee by completing and sending in the Head of Contingent Registration Form (Appendix 1-1). If there are any NSOs that have not appointed a Head of Contingent yet, please expedite the appointment and send in the form to the Organizing Committee.

• Building a Contingent Management Team

Forming and managing a Jamboree Contingent is an important task. We recommend each Contingent to recruit members to form a Contingent Management Team (CMT). The CMT is a group of leaders with knowledge and



experience in financial management, international travel, taking care of young people and international Scouting. The CMT will also be an ideal opportunity for all young adults, regardless of gender or age, to be trained as leaders for the future. The number of CMT members is limited based on the number of participants of the Contingent. Please refer to the table in Bulletin 1 (Contingent Management Team on page 5.)

• Complete and send Contingent Registration Form

The next step is to complete and send the Contingent Registration Form (Appendix 1-2), which would confirm the size of the Contingent from your NSO to serve as the basis of Contingent allocation and Jamboree fee payment. The submission of this registration form is due by 31 December 2021.

Please note that 9 Scouts with 1 Leader will form a patrol and 4 patrols will form a unit (i.e. a unit is made up of 36 Scouts and 4 Leaders.).

* Any units smaller than the size mentioned above may be grouped together with other patrols or units from other NSOs.

* Please consult the Organizing Committee if you require a change of formation due to Leaders or Scouts with special needs or other valid reasons.

• Estimate your budget and calculate the Jamboree fee for your Contingent

The next stage is to prepare the budget for your Contingent. In addition to the Jamboree fee charged by the Organizing Committee, you will need to pay for many other items such as travel, insurance, preparatory meetings and shipping of equipment. Once you have budgeted for all of your costs, you can decide the number of participants, Unit Leaders, IST members and CMT members you will recruit to your Contingent, and set the Jamboree fee for your Contingent.

• Start promoting the Jamboree locally

Now is the time to start promoting the Jamboree locally and nationally to generate interest among Scouts and Leaders. Promotional materials can be downloaded from the HoC Facebook group. For other questions regarding promotions or communications, please contact the Organizing Committee.

The Jamboree fee must be paid in Korean won. Each registered NSO will receive two invoices, one for the initial deposit and one to pay the remaining balance. Once payment is made, each NSO will have to send a copy of certificate of remittance to 25wsj@scout.or.kr. After the payment deadline, a 10% surcharge will apply and NSOs will receive another invoice including the added surcharge amount.

• Refund policy

1. Refund policy

Refunds will be considered at the NSO level ONLY in response to a request submitted by the NSO Head of Contingent or International Commissioner for a reduction in an NSO's approved allocation or registration numbers.

Refunds will be made directly to the NSO only in Korean won after the deduction of the deposit, surcharge and any expenses that occur in the refund process.

[Example] A 'Category C' Contingent that registered 87 members
If the Contingent requests a refund before 31 January 2023, they will get credit for payment for 4 people and the amount is KRW 370,000 per person and the total is KRW 1,480,000.

*(KRW 570,000 – KRW 200,000) × 4 people(87×5%=4.35)

2. COVID-19 situation

The Organizing Committee continues to monitor the COVID-19 situation both on the ground in Korea and around the world to assess how it affects members of WOSM. There are signs of optimism as vaccination rates are on the rise and serious cases of COVID-19 are on the decline. The government of the Republic of Korea currently offers quarantine exemptions to fully vaccinated travelers from low-risk countries. We remain optimistic that the worst of the pandemic will be behind us in 2023, however we will strive to ensure that the proper Standard Operating Procedures are in place to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

As always, the best advice is to follow your own national health ministry's guidance. All participants will be required to observe all COVID-19 protocols to enter Korea in accordance with the policies of both their respective national government and the Korean government as of the date of entry. In the case of event cancellation caused by a policy of the Korean government, the payment will be refunded after the deduction of any expenses that occur in the refund process.

3. Potential risks

If the Jamboree is interrupted because of potential risks or events outside the Committee's control (e.g., acts of terrorism, natural disasters, etc.), the Organizing Committee will not refund the fees paid.

The Organizing Committee will review requests submitted by NSOs for credit or refunds that are made because of the denial of a participant's application for a visa to attend the 25th World Scout Jamboree.

Refunds will not be considered if a participant is denied a visa to attend the Jamboree because the individual did not follow the application procedures, deadlines, or processes as outlined by the appropriate government authorities. In such a case, relevant evidence should be submitted.



▲ 1st Heads of Contingent Meeting

The 1st Heads of Contingent Meeting for the 25th World Scout Jamboree will be held virtually from 22 to 24 October 2021 through on an online platform due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We will upload all Jamboree related Presentation Video Clips by 30 September 2021, After watching videos, Heads of Contingent are requested to submit written questions to the Jamboree Planning Team by 8 October 2021 by email or google forms.

The 1st Heads of Contingent meeting will be based on collected written questions and additional questions if any, will be discussed in Q & A sessions during the meeting.

Each NSO is requested to send three representatives to participate the 1st Heads of Contingent meeting and same will be live-streamed on online for others.

▲ Operation-K

The purpose of Operation-K is to ensure that as many Scouts as possible have the opportunity to attend the 25th World Scout Jamboree, regardless of their economic circumstances. The Operation-K solidarity programme will support up to 1 Leader and 9 Scouts per NSO to attend and participate in the Jamboree.

The Organizing Committee will ensure that the facilities and experience offered to Scouts supported by the Solidarity Fund will be the same as those of all other Jamboree participants.

This solidarity programme is supported by Korean government and there are some strict policies related to it. In accordance with its accounting system, registered beneficiaries cannot be changed. Therefore, NSOs should pay close attention to who is selected and registered in the process. After selected individuals return to their country, the President or International Commissioner of the NSO is requested to send a signed letter to the Organizing Committee to confirm their safe return.

 - 1 Leader should be able to fluently communicate in English, French or Korean and capable of taking care of young people.
 - 9 Scouts in financial difficulties who demonstrate good Scout spirit.

▲ Jamboree Site Layout






▲ Official entry point and transportation to the Jamboree site

• Entry Point: Incheon International Airport(ICN)

Our official entry point, Incheon international Airport (ICN), is a hub airport that has been ranked in the top 3 for international cargo and top 5 for international passengers. It is also recognised today as a key airport that connects the airways of the world. We believe Incheon Airport is the most appropriate site to welcome Jamboree participants, since it has ranked 1st place for 12 consecutive years in Airport Service Quality.

The airport has two different terminals and the Jamboree Planning Team will set up a booth in each terminal during the entry and departure dates. Jamboree ISTs will guide Contingents to airport facilities and transportation to the Jamboree site.

Participants are asked to add their travel details, including flight schedules, into the online registration system, which is expected to open in November 2021. Details regarding the entry and transportation process will be announced in the next bulletin.



• ICN and Jamboree site distance info

- Airport to Jamboree site: 280 km
- Duration by vehicle: 3 hours and 30 minutes
- Buses will make one stop at an expressway rest area.

▲ Cargo Shipment



Many participating NSOs will need to send equipment and materials for exhibitions, headquarters, food houses, etc. in order to facilitate Contingent management and assist other participants. In this regard, dispatching such items by cargo shipment would be an ideal choice and we advise participating NSOs to send a shipment pallets or 20-feet container only in order for them to be delivered to the designated location at the Jamboree site in time.

Restrictions and limits regarding cargo shipments must be thoroughly checked in advance and all cargo should be properly packaged for safe delivery.

* Pallets should be packaged in plastic and include a hook as the cargo will be stored outside.

Further detailed information will be announced later. NSOs interested to learn more specific details may contact the Organizing Committee for more information.

▲ Food Houses

Food is one of the easiest and most interesting ways to introduce people to new cultures and promote diversity and inclusion. Food Houses at previous World Scout Jamborees received positive responses from youth participants, so we hope that many contingent will join in the Food Houses.

The Food House will be located in a designated area near the World Scout Centre so that Jamboree par-



ticipants, other visitors and guests can also enjoy the experience.

The Organizing Committee plans to assist every Contingent with the supply of ingredients and tents that reflect appropriate cultural elements by maintaining close cooperation with them.

We are discussing related matters with the relevant authorities to ensure optimal convenience for Contingent that wish to join the Food House.

▲ Pre / Post Activities

A period of 12 days might not be enough for participants to explore and experience Korea. This is why the Organizing Committee is planning Pre/Post activities for Scouts who want to experience other diverse parts of Korea.

For this Jamboree, two different types of activities will be offered. The first is a home-stay that allows participants to enjoy the Korean lifestyle by staying at a local Korean home. However, due to the current COVID-19 pandemic not many families are currently willing to volunteer their homes. The Organizing Committee will do its best to register more houses so that many Scouts from around the world can share a precious moment in Korea. The home-stay option will be arranged on a first-come, first-served basis.

The second type of activity is called the D(Dream)-Tour. We plan to design and assist a customised tour programme according to the themes and wishes of what each Contingent would like to experience in Korea. For Contingent Management Teams who enter Korea five days prior to the Jamboree starting date for pre-training purposes, we will liaise with suitable accommodations such as university dormitories. We could also set up a DMZ tour for participants who are interested in peace and would like to directly experience the realities related to the division of Korea.






